

A Brief Guide to MLA Style (7th edition - 2009*)

The following are examples for citing resources (that you have quoted or paraphrased) in a list of **Works Cited**. The list is arranged alphabetically by the last name of the author. If there is no author, file the citation alphabetically by the title of the resource.

*MLA 7th ed. Includes significant changes, including but not limited to: *Italics* are used instead of underline; URLs are not required for Web resources; and medium of publication is always noted (eg. Web, Print, DVD, etc).

Note: Entries should be double-spaced – they are shown here single-spaced to save paper.

Web page with Author, but no publication date accessed on April 16, 2008	Cawthon Lang, Kristina. <i>Primate Factsheets: Chimpanzee (Pan troglodytes) Behavior</i> , n.d. Web. 16 April 2008.
Web page with no author or date (if a website lacks this info, reconsider using it in research).	"Biofuels." <i>Journey to Forever</i> , n.d. Web. 9 Sept. 2008. *The 2009 MLA update does not require URLs. However, in this case, given the lack of information, the inclusion of the URL may be considered appropriate. Ask your instructor for his/her views on including URLs in the new MLA.
