

Nursing Degree - Direct Transfer Agreement/Major Related Program (DTA/MRP)

The TCC Nursing Degree (DTA/MRP) is a three-year program for students who complete their prerequisites and nursing training at the community college level and then transfer to a university to complete the last 45 credits to earn a Bachelors in Science in Nursing (BSN). The TCC DTA/MRP degree will begin spring quarter, 2019. The first cohort of students will be selected from the lottery occurring after the December 1, 2018 - January 7, 2019 application cycle.

* ENGL& 102 or ENGL& 103 may be accepted for the ENGL&101 factored course. To do this, there can only be one attempt at ENGL& 101 (in this case you would need to have one attempt at ENGL& 102 or ENG &103 with grade of a 'B' or better).

**** If you took CHEM& 110 or high school chemistry prior to fall quarter 2018, you meet this requirement.

*****BIOL& 100 may substitute for BIOL& 160 in some cases. Consult a Nursing advisor.

Admission Details



CHECK YOUR GRADES AND ATI TEAS SCORES CAREFULLY BEFORE YOU APPLY TO BE CERTAIN YOU MEET THE REQUIREMENTS. If you have not met them please do not apply. Your application will be disqualified.

Prerequisites

All prerequisite courses must be completed before applying to the Nursing Program (there will be some exceptions for the spring 2019 application cycle so please attend an information session, visit with an advisor, or call the nursing program at 253-566-5218 for details).

Additional Requirements

Students who want to apply to the Nursing Program must do the following **before** submitting their application:

1. Complete the ATI TEAS Exam and receive at least a 70% overall score. Applicants will also need the following minimum scores in each section:
 - Reading 75%
 - Science 63%
 - Math 72%
 - English 70%.

If you don't meet all the minimum score requirements above you can retake the test to improve your score but the test cannot be taken more than twice in the year prior to the application deadline date. Test scores are valid for a three-year period.

2. Complete all *factored* courses with a minimum grade of "B" (within two attempts in a five-year period).
3. Complete all *non-factored* courses with a grade of "C" or higher.
4. Obtain a Washington State Nursing Assistant Certification (NAC).
5. If you have not taken any courses at TCC you must complete the TCC Admissions Application to become a student at the college: https://csprd.ctclink.us/psc/cbf/EMPLOYEE/SA/c/JP_AD_MNU.IP_AD_LOGIN_CMP.GBL **Note: This is not the Nursing Program Application. The program application is done in your portal after admissions to the college.**

Applying to the Program

Students who have successfully completed the academic and non-academic requirements listed above are qualified to apply to the Nursing Program. **Please do not apply if you have not met all requirements.** Applications are carefully reviewed and those which have met the requirements will be eligible for admission to the lottery. See the next section on "Lottery" for additional details. There are three application periods for the Nursing Program each year:

Lottery

All qualified applicants are entered into the lottery and receive 40 base points. However, additional points can be received or subtracted as indicated below. Additional points can increase your chance of being selected for entry into the program. In addition, penalty points can also be subtracted from your base score.

A grade of A- or above in BIOL& 241, 242, or 260.	10 points each
US military service.	10 points
15 or more college-level credits taken at TCC.	5 points
30 or more college-level credits taken at TCC.	10 points
Penalty for each biology retake (BIOL& 241, 242, or 260)	-5 points for each retake.

Lotteries are generally held several weeks after the last day of each application period and results are posted on the TCC website. Lottery recipients are also notified via their TCC email.
