

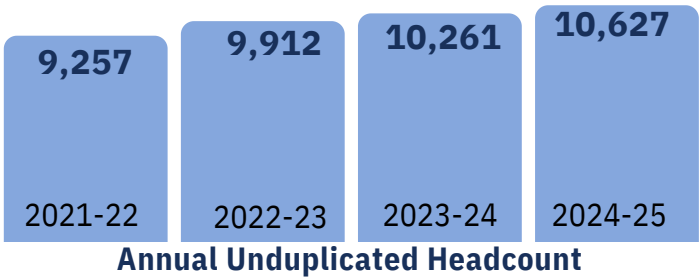

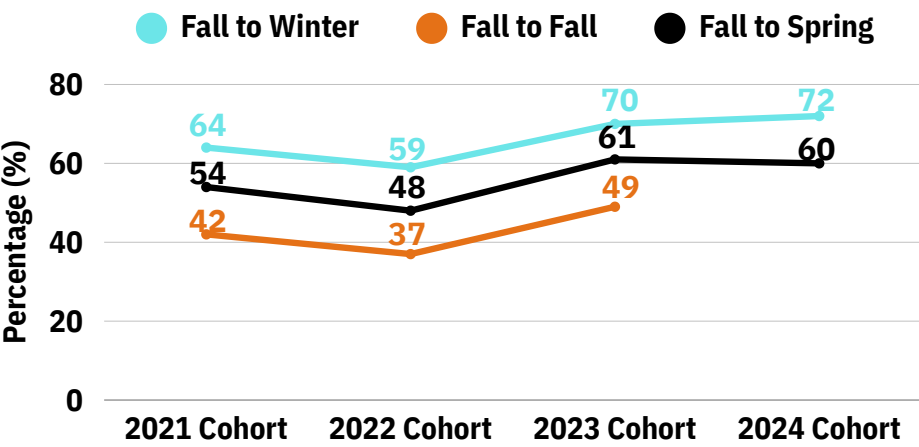

Retention: First-time, First-year students

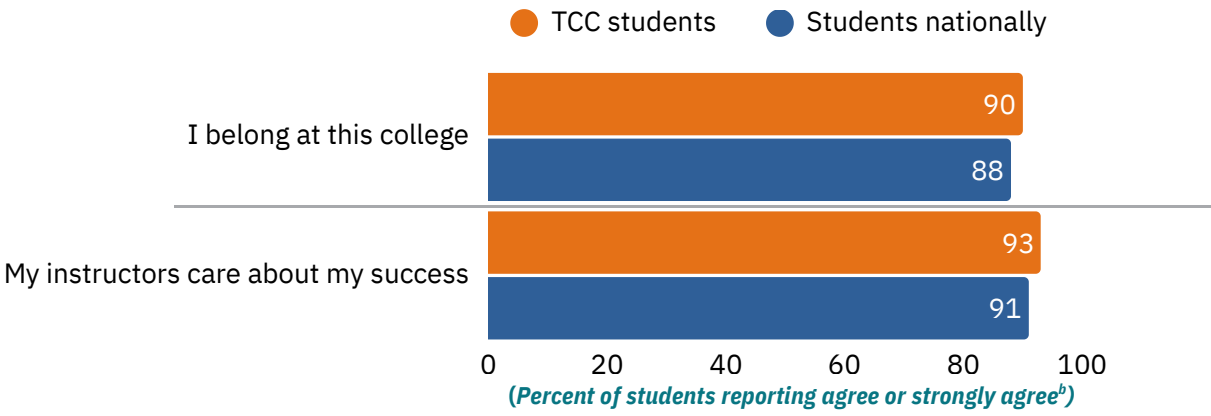
Overall strong upward trajectory in retention despite dip in 2022 rates



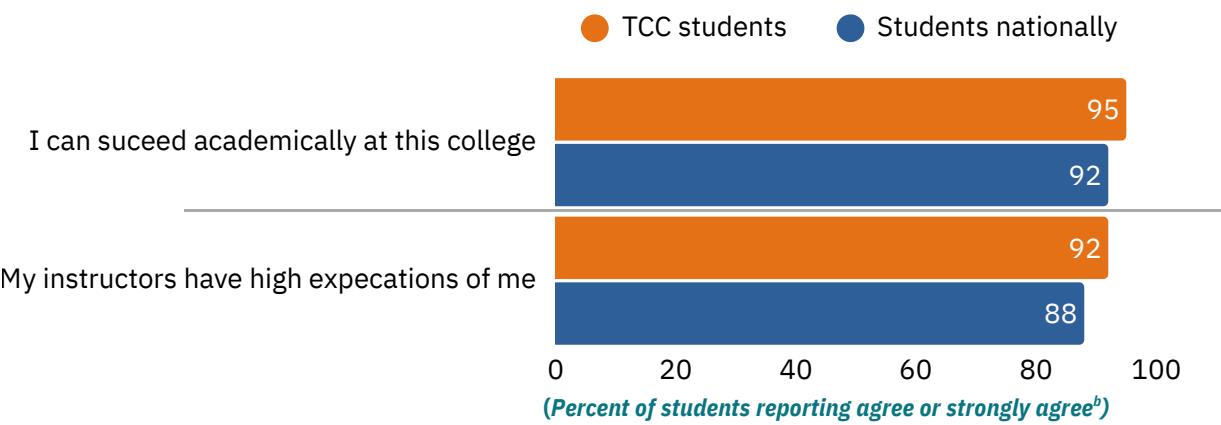

SENSE OF BELONGING & CARE: TCC students reported a higher sense of belonging and care than students nationally^a

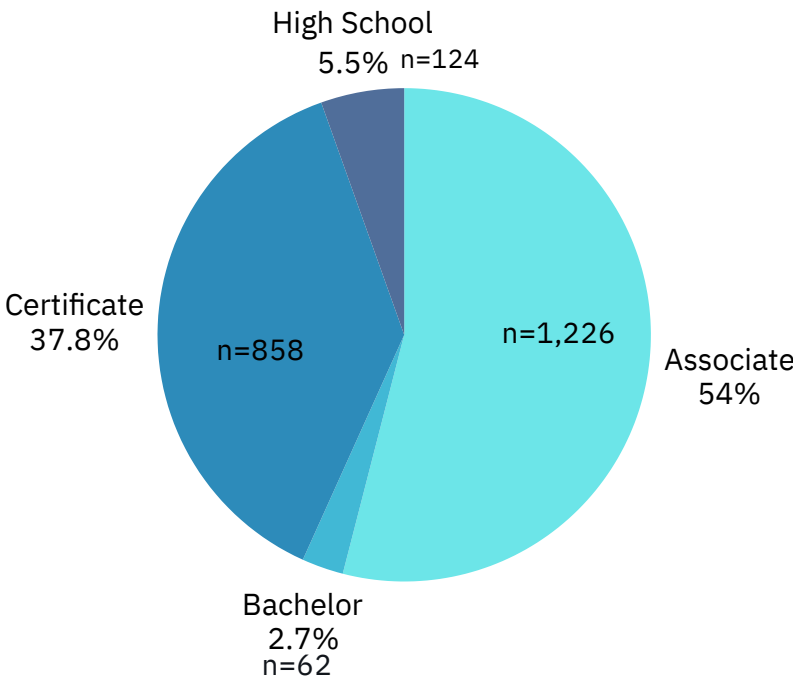


SELF-EFFICACY\CONFIDENCE: TCC students reported higher confidence than students nationally*

2023-2024 Employment Outcomes

The employment outcomes between students completing (completers) and students leaving early (early leavers) remains substantial

	Completers	Early Leavers
 Employment Rate	 About 7 in 10 were employed (73%, n=421)	 About 6 in 10 were employed (64%; n=302)
 Median HOURLY wage	\$29.07	\$24.51
 Median ANNUAL earnings	\$54,649	\$39,564
