Dear Executive Vice President Treat:

This is in reply to electronic correspondence received in our office on May 25, 2017, requesting approval from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) for Tacoma Community College to add a Bachelor of Applied Science degree program in Community Health with emphases in Community Health Professional, Advanced Respiratory Care, and Paramedicine to its education offerings, effective fall 2018. The Bachelor of Applied Science degree program in Community Health requires 180 credits to completion and will be delivered using a distance education instructional modality. The College Curriculum Committee reviewed and approved the new educational offerings on February 6, 2017, the College Board of Trustees approved the new degree proposal on May 10, 2017, and the Washington State Board of Community and Technical Colleges authorized the College to offer the new degree program on May 11, 2017.

Building upon existing programs, Tacoma Community College will add three dedicated full-time faculty positions to teach classes, advise students and administer the new program curriculum. The College will increase the budget which supports the existing director position for Bachelor of Applied Science programs. Student support services and information resources in support of instruction and students will be enhanced each year beginning in year one, continuing through year 5 of the program's implementation.

Insofar as the addition of this new degree program is in concert with the Mission and Core Themes of the College, the Commission has approved the abovementioned change as a *minor change* under Commission Policy, *Substantive Change*. Accordingly, the addition of the Bachelor of Applied Science degree program in Community Health with emphases in Community Health Professional, Advanced Respiratory Care, and Paramedicine using a distance education instructional modality is now included under the accreditation of Tacoma Community College.
