

Nursing Degree - Direct Transfer Agreement/Major Related Program (DTA/MRP)

The TCC Nursing Degree (DTA/MRP) is a three-year program for students who complete their prerequisites and nursing training at the community college level and then transfer to a university to complete the last 45 credits to earn a Bachelors in Science in Nursing (BSN).

^{*} ENGL& 102 or ENGL& 103 or ENGL 235 may be accepted in lieu of the ENGL&101 factored course. To use one of these courses, there may be no more than 3 combined attempts in the last 5 years for the two English courses that you use as pre-requisites. (Example: you take ENGL& 101 and get a B-, then you take ENGL& 102 and get a B-, you would then need to either retake ENGL& 101 or ENGL& 102 or take ENGL& 103 or ENGL& 235 as your third attempt, achieving a B or better to meet the requirement. If successful, that B- grade on ENGL& 101 or ENGL& 102 would be used as your non-factored English course.)

^{**} You can substitute BIOL & 160 with BIOL & 211 (Majors Cellular) or BIOL & 222 (Introduction to Cellular & Molecular Biology). If you are a TCC student and have taken higher level Biology classes, you can contact Ken Cushman at kcushman@tacomacc.edu to arrange taking a challenge exam for BIOL& 160 credit. *** NUTR& 101 can be used to meet this requirement.

Prerequisites

Additional Requirements

Students who want to apply to the Nursing Program must do the following **before** submitting their application:

- Complete the ATI TEAS Exam and receive at least a 70% overall score. Applicants will also need the following minimum scores in each section:
 - Reading 75%
 - Science 63%
 - Math 72%
 - English 70%.

If you don't meet all the minimum score requirements above you can retake the test to improve your score but the test cannot be taken more than twice in the year prior to the application deadline date. Test scores are valid for a four-year period.

- 2. Complete all *factored* courses with a minimum grade of "B" (within two attempts in a five-year period).
- 3. Complete all *non-factored* courses with a grade of "C" or higher.
- 4. Obtain a Washington State Nursing Assistant Certification (NAC).

Note: This is <u>not</u> the Nursing Program Application. The program application is done in your portal after admissions to the college.

Applying to the Program

Students who have successfully completed the academic <u>and</u> non-academic requirements listed above are qualified to apply to the Nursing Program. Applications are carefully reviewed and those which have met the requirements will be eligible for admission to the lottery. See the next section on "Lottery" for additional details. There are three application periods for the Nursing Program each year:

Application Periods	Program Start	# Students Accepted
June 1 – July 1	Fall and Winter	24 + 24
Dec 1 – Jan 7	Spring	24

Lottery

All qualified applicants are entered into the lottery and receive 40 base points. However, additional points can be received or subtracted as indicated below. Additional points can increase your chance of being selected for entry into the program. In addition, penalty points can also be subtracted from your base score.

Actions which generate additional lottery points or subtracts lottery points	Additional points awarded and subtracted
A grade of A- or above in BIOL& 241, 242, or 260.	10 points each
US military service.	10 points
15 or more college-level credits taken at TCC.	5 points
30 or more college-level credits taken at TCC.	10 points
Penalty for each biology retake (BIOL& 241, 242, or 260)	-5 points for each retake.

Lotteries are generally held 3-4 weeks after the last day of each application period. Lottery recipients are notified via their TCC email.
