Early Achievers Grant (EAG) Eligibility Requirements

Early Childhood Education Program only

Employed at an Early Achievers Participating Facility.

Employed in an eligible role for 3 months prior to the start of the quarter

Eligible Roles: Family Home Owner/Licensee, Center Director, Assistant Director, Program Supervisor, Lead Teacher, Assistant Teacher

Minimum of 10 hours per week or 40 hours per month

Quarterly Employment is verified in MERIT.

Fees

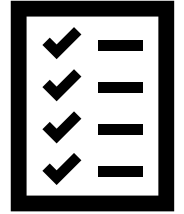

Grants are for start-up, gap filling, and dependent on budget

Workforce Education Grants

Summary of Key Points



- ✓ **Not full-degree funding:** Workforce grants help *start* programs or *fill gaps* (e.g., tuition/textbooks), not cover entire degrees.
- ✓ **Case-by-Case:** Assistance is provided based on *available funds*, *demonstrated need*, and *alignment with program priorities*.
- ✓ **Student-driven requests:** Funding is *not automatic*. Students must submit Quarterly Funding Request Form each quarter.



Meeting the eligibility criteria does not guarantee funding every quarter.

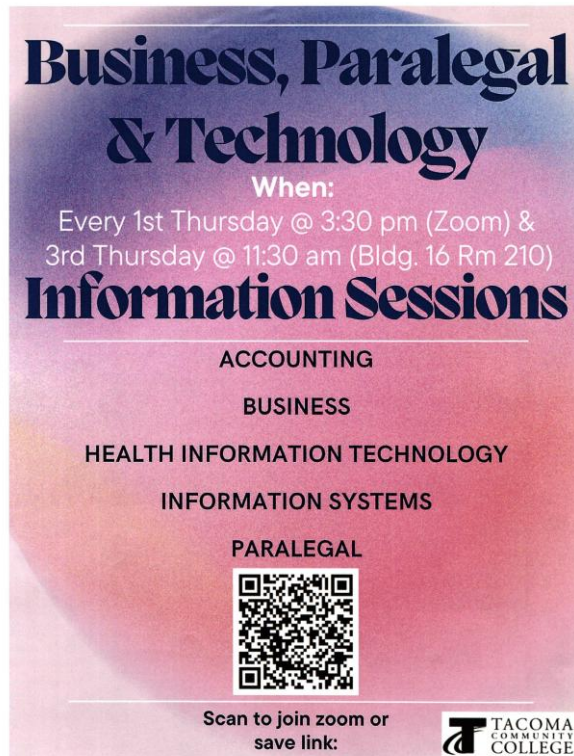

Scholarships: Free money; based on merit, need, talent, or field of study.

Federal/State Work-study: Earn aid through part-time work; limited availability.

Loans: Must be repaid with interest.

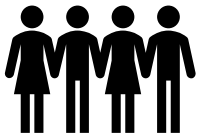
