At TCC, we want to make sure our students are not going hungry while pursuing their education. The Titan Food Pantry has supported students and their families facing food insecurity for over eight years, serving more than 150 individuals each week, and that number is expected to rise. During this difficult time, we understand that many people are in need of food, and we remain committed to supporting our campus community.

The pantry is available to all students and, beginning Monday, November 10, will have extended hours from Monday to Thursday (hours vary). It is located in Building 17. >>> From Incarceration to Inspiration

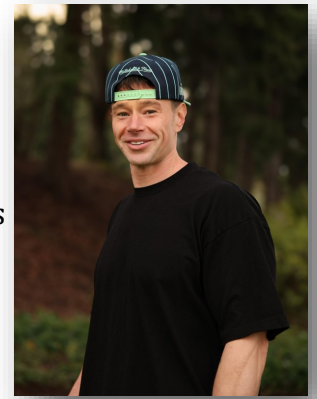
From a prison cell to a college classroom, Alex Rogers has transformed a story of hardship into one of resilience, empowerment, and hope. His journey is not just about earning degrees, it's about reclaiming a life once thought lost.

While incarcerated, Alex began pursuing education as a path forward, earning an AA in Liberal Arts from Walla Walla Community College and a Small Business Management Certificate from Edmonds Community College. Upon release, he continued his education at TCC, pursuing an AAS in Business Entrepreneurship. But academic achievements are only part of Alex's powerful story.

Reentering society came with a different set of challenges, ones that weren't found in textbooks. "The intangibles," Alex shared, were the hardest understanding social cues, body language, communication. Years of institutionalization had left him disconnected from the social rhythms of everyday life. He felt as though no one could understand what he was going through. Yet, through connecting with fellow students, many of whom carried their own stories of struggle, he found a sense of belonging and strength. He shared that "being at TCC has made me feel whole and like I've reconnected with pieces of me that I thought were lost forever. He credits his success to one life-changing realization: the *power of choice*, "every day, I got to choose who I wanted to be, even during challenges, I still had a choice."

What began as a path toward a business degree shifted when Alex discovered a deep passion for Human Services. With support from TCC and the broader Tacoma community, he found opportunities for career development, stability, and healing. He received help through the Titan Food Pantry, affordable housing, on-campus employment, and Workforce Education funding that made tuition, books, and fees accessible. Now pursuing a career in the Human Services field, Alex is committed to giving back, helping others navigate the same difficult path he once walked.

Alex's story is a powerful reminder of what's possible when determination meets opportunity. His courage to rebuild, his openness to change, and his commitment to choosing growth even in the face of overwhelming obstacles are nothing short of inspiring. We're all rooting for Alex as he continues his journey forward!

I began working at Tacoma Community College (TCC) in 2023, but I've spent nearly 15 years in the field of education. I grew up in Lakewood and have lived in Pierce County my entire life. I love the Pacific Northwest and the energy of the City of Tacoma. I enjoy working with our students and helping them navigate their educational journeys, wherever they are at. Workforce Navigators provide personalized guidance, connecting students with resources, support services, and career-focused opportunities tailored to their area of study. I support students pursuing degrees and certificates in Early Childhood Education (ECE), Human Services Professional (HSP), and several of our Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) programs. Additionally, I am the Program Contact for the Early Achievers Grant program that supports ECE students as they gain the necessary education they need to continue as child care providers in our local Pierce County child care centers. In addition to assisting students apply for educational funding, I participate in outreach events in the community and our Workforce workshops to connect students about our services and resources that help guide them during their time at TCC and beyond.
