

CALL FOR ENTRIES: **Indigenous Artists Exhibition**

EXHIBITION DATES: Nov. 17-Dec. 18, 2026

Indigenous artists are invited to submit entries for a juried art exhibition. Artwork will be juried by:

- Neeka Cook, a Tlingit, Tsimshian and Haida artist from the Chookaneidi (Eagle/Brown Bear) clan;
- Michael "Muck" Hall, a Tlingit, T'ak Dein Taan, Raven Clan, Sockeye house artist, and Puyallup Tribe Culture Coordinator.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Sept. 1, 2026

Artists who wish to have their work considered should submit the following:

- Applicant information that includes:
 - » name
 - » affiliation (To ensure accurate labeling and to respect cultural protocols, please provide your enrolled Tribal Nation, Nation of descent or Indigenous affiliation (e.g. "Navajo Nation" or "Cree/Métis")
 - » address
 - » phone number (day and evening)
 - » email
- Three digital images of available work. Image info must include:
 - » artist's name
 - » title and date of work
 - » medium
 - » dimensions
- Résumé (education and information related to your artistic career)
- Artist's statement (three-sentence statement about the works of art in the exhibition)
- How would you like to be credited on your artwork's wall label?
(e.g., "Jane Doe, Haida" or "John Smith, enrolled member of the Cherokee Nation")
- Exhibition history

The résumé, exhibition history and artist statement will be used to produce didactic panels and are not a factor in jury selection.
