

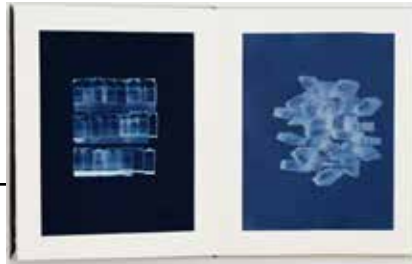
CALL FOR ENTRIES: **Printmaking Exchange**

Ishii & Copeland Exhibition and Printmaking Exchange: Jan. 5-29, 2027

Print Exchange & Artist Discussion: Jan. 13, 2027, 4-6pm

An opportunity to respond via the printmaking medium to the THEME: Monochrome.

Ayumi Ishii and Kate Copeland work individually and collaboratively to explore the temporal, fleeting, and unseen. Their work identifies and reveals systems and patterns. Their collaborative practice spans letterpress printing, alternative photography, sculpture, and artists books, with a shared focus on materiality and process.



PRINT EXCHANGE SUBMISSION DEADLINE: Friday, Dec. 11, 2026

Artists should submit the following:

- Applicant information that includes:
 - » name
 - » address, phone number (day and evening), and email
- Prints can be in response to the ISHII & COPELAND exhibition images on this form, but it is not a requirement. Prints can also be existing or newly created by the artist.
- The printed image must be printed on 8"x10" sheet of archival printmaking paper. The prints should be hand-pulled (no digital prints). Submission does not need to be framed.
- **Artists will be asked to provide 16 editions of their print for the exchange.**
- Artists will also be invited to select 15 prints done by other artists throughout the exhibition. The Gallery at TCC will retain the print on view for the purpose of fundraising.
- Resumé (education and information related to your artistic career)

The resumé, exhibition history and artist statement will be used to produce didactic panels and are not a factor in jury selection.
